► The <u>Central East Local Health Integration Network (LHIN)</u> Board of Directors invited Entité 4 to do a presentation on February 26. Entité 4 had the opportunity to discuss its mandate, objectives and results regarding health services in French.



► On January 16<sup>th</sup> a <u>Lunch and Share</u> session was held on the principle of active offer of French language health services. This meeting took place a few months after the first one in August which had great success

► The Coalition for Healthy Francophone Communities in Scarborough (CHFCS) was launched in January. Their activities will focus primarily on health promotion and prevention, such as chronic disease self-management, mental health and healthy lifestyle management.
