Training for health care professionals in Central East LHIN underscores the importance of language in health service delivery

Often, as patients age they lose the ability to understand and communicate in their second language. Patients that struggle to make themselves understood can become frustrated and exhibit responsive behaviours.

Entité 4 is pleased to report that part of the training program for health care professionals working with these patients deals with the use of language and the need to work in a language mastered by the patient.

To date, more than 1,100 health service providers working in the Central East LHIN have received this training. These health care practitioners are thus more attuned to the needs of francophone seniors.

Adult Mental Health Continuum

Mental illness and addictions take a heavy toll on people's lives – both for those who are suffering and those who are watching their loved ones suffer. In 2011, the Ontario government launched the provincial strategy, *Open Minds, Healthy Minds,* to tackle mental illness and addictions head-on.

Language barriers pose a particular challenge in the provision of mental health and addiction services since evaluation, treatment and rehabilitation are linked to language and communication between patients and health service providers.

To support the development of health care service in French, Entité 4 is launching a project to develop a vision for a continuum of care in the mental health sector for adults.
