
FRANCOPHONES LIVE IN NORTH YORK WEST¹

OF THE POPULATION




FRANCOPHONE POPULATION IN NORTH YORK WEST

Does the Ontario Health Team for North York West serve a designated area?

The City of Toronto, including North York, is one of **26 designated areas across Ontario.**

Under the French Language Services Act, a person has the right to communicate in French with, and to receive available services in French from "any head or central office of a government agency or institution of the Legislature, and has the same right in respect of any other office of such agency or institution that is located in or serves an area designated".

Are there any identified or designated Health Service Providers (HSPs) in your OHT?

Supporting the **identification** and **designation** processes of HSPs for the provision of French Language Health Services (FLHS) is an integral part of Entité 4's work to ensure sustainability of services over time.

The **identification process** is the selection of HSPs with capacity to plan and deliver safe and quality services in French.

Designation is the legal recognition by the Ontario government of an organization's ability and ongoing commitment to provide high-quality services in French.

Black Creek Community Health Centre

Home and Community Care:

coordination of care is subject to the *French Language Services Act.* Home and Community Care services are provided by the Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs).

Spotlight on French Language Services

Black Creek Community Health Centre

In 2018/2019, Black Creek Community Health Centre received funding to expand access to an interprofessional care team, which included enhanced French Language Services capacity through a bilingual patient navigator, community health worker and registered nurses.

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THE BILINGUAL HEALTH SYSTEM NAVIGATOR AT BLACK CREEK CHC HELPED **329 PATIENTS** NAVIGATE THROUGH SERVICES. OUTREACH AND HEALTH PROMOTION EFFORTS AT BLACK CREEK CHC REACHED MORE THAN 500 INDIVIDUALS.

Why is it important to develop FLHS in North York West?

Patients and their families struggle to navigate the health care system, especially when seeking services in French. The integration of bilingual health promoters and patient navigators into health care teams is an emerging best practice in serving minority populations.

Delivering these services in French for Francophones is a key component of patient-centered care for priority populations.
