The rich diversity in the Francophone populations served by Entité 4 translates into complex and varied health needs.



FRANCOPHONES LIVE IN NORTH SIMCOE¹ OF THE POPULATION


FRANCOPHONE POPULATION IN NORTH SIMCOE

Does the Ontario Health Team for North Simcoe serve a designated area?

Two of **26 designated areas across Ontario**, namely the Town of Penetanguishene and the Township of Tiny, are located in North Simcoe.

Under the French Language Services Act (FLSA), a person has the right to communicate in French with, and to receive available services in French from "any head or central office of a government agency or institution of the Legislature, and has the same right in respect of any other office of such agency or institution that is located in or serves an area designated."

Are there any identified or designated Health Service Providers (HSPs) in your OHT?

Supporting the **identification** and **designation** processes of HSPs for the provision of French Language Health Services (FLHS) is an integral part of Entité 4's work to ensure sustainability of services over time.

The **identification process** is the selection of HSPs with capacity to plan and deliver safe and quality services in French.

Designation is the legal recognition by the Ontario government of an organization's ability and ongoing commitment to provide high-quality services in French.

Identified HSPs in North Simcoe:

- Georgian Manor
- Hospice Huronia
- Waypoint Centre for Mental Health Care
- Wendat Community Programs

Designated HSPs in North Simcoe:

- CHIGAMIK CHC
- Georgian Bay General Hospital

Home and Community Care: coordination of care is subject to the *French Language Services Act.* Home and Community Care services are provided by the Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs).

Spotlight on French Language Services

CHIGAMIK Community Health Centre

With the support of Entité 4, the NSM LHIN and the Francophone community, CHIGAMIK CHC suceeded in achieving designation under the FLSA. An interdisciplinary team provides a full range of French language services including primary health care, diabetes education programs, dietitian services, mental health services, physiotherapy and health promotion activities

Georgian Bay General Hospital

Community hospital that achieved a partial designation in 2017 for the ambulatory care program and finance, human resources and telecommunications services carried out on behalf of the Ministry of Health.

Waypoint Centre for Mental Health Care

Specialty mental health hospital providing acute and longer term psychiatric inpatient and outpatient services.

Wendat Community Programs

Community support, treatment and rehabilitation services for seniors with care needs and adults with mental health needs.





What other French Language Health Services are located nearby?

Francophones in North Simcoe may choose to access other FLHS within the North Simcoe Muskoka area.

Canadian Mental Health Association Simcoe County

Community mental health agency with bilingual case managers and clinicians.

Why is it important to develop FLHS in North Simcoe?

Patients and their families struggle to navigate the health care system, especially when seeking services in French. The integration of bilingual health promoters and patient navigators into health care teams is an emerging best practice in serving minority populations.

Delivering these services in French for Francophones is a key component of patient-centered care for priority populations.


