
FRANCOPHONES LIVE IN NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY<sup>1</sup>

OF THE POPULATION




# FRANCOPHONE POPULATION IN NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY

#### Does the Ontario Health Team for Northumberland County serve a designated area?

Although none of **26 designated** areas across Ontario fall within Northumberland County, the area lies in close proximity to Hastings County where 3,510 Francophones make up 2.6% of the population.

Under the French Language Services Act, a person has the right to communicate in French with, and to receive available services in French from "any head or central office of a government agency or institution of the Legislature, and has the same right in respect of any other office of such agency or institution that is located in or serves an area designated".

# Are there any identified or designated Health Service Providers (HSPs) in your OHT?

Supporting the **identification** and **designation** processes of HSPs for the provision of French Language Health Services (FLHS) is an integral part of Entité 4's work to ensure sustainability of services over time.

The **identification process** is the selection of HSPs with capacity to plan and deliver safe and quality services in French.

**Designation** is the legal recognition by the Ontario government of an organization's ability and ongoing commitment to provide high-quality services in French.

#### **Home and Community Care:**

coordination of care is subject to the French Language Services Act. Home and Community Care services are provided by the Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs).

#### Canadian Mental Health Association Durham

With Entité 4's support, CMHA Durham obtained funding to hire a French speaking outreach worker.


