


FRANCOPHONE POPULATION IN SOUTH SIMCOE

Does the Ontario Health Team for South Simcoe serve a designated area?

The Township of Essa, one of **26 designated areas across Ontario,** is in close proximity to South Simcoe.

Under the French Language Services Act, a person has the right to communicate in French with, and to receive available services in French from "any head or central office of a government agency or institution of the Legislature, and has the same right in respect of any other office of such agency or institution that is located in or serves an area designated".

Are there any identified or designated Health Service Providers (HSPs) in your OHT?

Supporting the **identification** and **designation** processes of HSPs for the provision of French Language Health Services (FLHS) is an integral part of Entité 4's work to ensure sustainability of services over time.

The **identification process** is the selection of HSPs with capacity to plan and deliver safe and quality services in French.

Designation is the legal recognition by the Ontario government of an organization's ability and ongoing commitment to provide high-quality services in French.

Home and Community Care:

coordination of care is subject to the French Language Services Act. Home and Community Care services are provided by the Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs).

Spotlight on French Language Services

What French Language Health Services are located nearby?

Francophones in South Simcoe often choose to access other nearby FLHS within North Simcoe County and York Region.

Barrie Community Health Centre

Thanks to a collaboration agreement between Barrie CHC, CHIGAMIK CHC and South Georgian Bay CHC, CHIGAMIK CHC's French speaking nurse practitioner offers services at Barrie CHC one day per week.

CHIGAMIK Community Health Centre

Designated HSP serving the Francophone population of the entire North Simcoe Muskoka region. An interdisciplinary team provides a full range of French language services including primary health care, diabetes education programs, dietitian services, mental health services, physiotherapy and health promotion activities

Canadian Mental Health Association Simcoe County

Entité 4 worked with Waypoint Centre for Mental Health Care to address gaps and plan for improved access to mental health and addictions services for Francophones. Since the fall of 2018 French-speaking clinicians are available at Canadian Mental Health Association Simcoe County and CHIGAMIK CHC.


